The PLOUGHING MATCH AND CATTLE SHOW, of the Northumberland Agricultural Society, will take place at Chatham, on THURSDAY, the 11th day of OCTOBER next.

PLOUGHING MATCH.

Instead of only one, there will this year be two class of Ploughmen, as competitors.
Class No. 1.—To consist of native Ploughmen, only 1 prize.
Class No. 2.—To be open to all, except those who have taken the 1st Prize two years.

RULES FOR THE REGULATION OF THE PLOUGHING MATCH.

Ist.—Teams must be on the ground by nine and ready to commence work by 10 o'clock, A. M. 2ad.—No person shall be eligible to compete for a prize who has not been a member of the Society at least one month previous to the day of competition.

3rd.—Three Judges will be appointed by the Board, and their names will be anounced by the Secretary on the morning of the Ploughing Match. 4th.—The Society will provide for the Ferryege of all Horses that have been actually engaged in the competition of the day.

5th.—That no person shall be allowed to assist the Ploughmen, or in any way, interfere with or accompany dum after the Ruiges have been staked off, and the first furrow or round has been completed.

or priz; on the ground that the animal exhibited
was not wortby of it.
