St. John, June 21.

Steamor Asia arrived at Halifax yesterday morning at 11 o'clock.

Expedition entered Straits of Kertch on Thursday, the 24th May, and commenced fring upon Amblaker; the garrion of which speedily abandoned the place, having pre-viously blown up the magazines.

Pelissier telegrephs. June 3 - That Ros-sians have evacuated Soudejah Kertch, and themselves destroying 60 guns and 6 mortars. The entire force is concentrated at Anapa.






