NOVA SCOTIA. Hon. Joseph Howe took passage on Friday after-non in the Steamship "America," for England,-The object of his mission has not been made public. Although the 8th June was wet and unfavourable for an excursion, nearly five hunared persons visited Sackville. Wednesday's Gazette contains the appointment of Auselan F. Comeau, late member of the Assembly for the Township of Clare, to a seat in the Legisla-tive Counsil. The Steamer America, Captain Long, arrived at this Port on Friday afternoor, from Boston, with 2°0 passengers for Liverpool, and 17 for Halitax. She takes home \$600,500 in American gold coin; \$507, 200 in gold bars ; 2,000 in silver coin ; \$3,466 in Eng-lish gold, \$259 in silver. Total \$1,013,445. She-had also 172 packages cargo.-Morning Journal.
