HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY.

The following was adopted as a Standing Rule in the Session of 1851:—

37th.—That no Bill of a private nature, or Petition for money or relief, shall be received by the House after the fourteenth day from the opening of the Session, both inclusive; and the Clerk of the House do, one month previous to the meeting of the Legislature, cause fifty copies of this Rule to be sent to each of the Clerks of the Peace in the several counties, for distribution, and cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette, and two newspapers in such county where newspapers are published.
