

concentrated their fire on the Malakoff and Mamelon, while other French batteries fired into the barracks and dockyard buildings.

After two hours fire, two guns were said to be dismounted in the Mamelon, and another to have quieted a third. But this is conjecture.

The Allies admit the Russians to have displayed wonderful fortitude and resolution in resistance, and though some advantages were gained, the main works could not be said to have been greatly injured.
