AT A MEETING of the BOARD of the MIRAMICH

AT A MEETING of the Board of the Miramich Pishery Society, held at Bowser's Hotel, on Thursday, the 24th April, 1856, the following Resolutions were unenimously adopted.

WHEREAS, at the Annual Meeting of the Miramichi Fishery Society which took place on the 18th January last, a Committee of Five Members was appointed to Report on the best means to be adopted for the advancement of the objects of the Society. And Whereas, the Report of that Committee has been submitted for the consideration of the present meeting, therefore—

RESOLVED, 1st. That in the opinion of this Board the best method of stimulating the Mackersel Fisherry and testing its practicability, at this place, will be for this Society to offer a Bounty to a Schooner, of the proper Tonnage, and well prepared, to prosecute successfully the Mackeral Fishery auring the coming season.

2nd.
