Whereas, by the Pevised Statutos, the Division Line between the Parishes of North Esk and Nelson in the County of Northumberland, is established by a line running West from Beaubear's Point, thereby altering the boundary of the said Parishes as by Law heretofore established; which has led to confusion and inconvenience to the inhabitants generally of both parishes, and must seriously injure the Parish of North Esk. And whereas, it appears to have been a mistake in the compilation, and it is decored advisable that that part of the said chapter be repealed, and the old line re-established. Be its therefore Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly.
