LATEST BY TELEGRAPH.

NEW YORK, Oct. 27. The Baltic arrived at New York Sunday evening, having left Liverpool on afternoon, 14th inst. Commercial panic had commenced in Great Britain, and was extending throughout the Continent. Consols had declined to 87 1/2. Numerous failures are reported. American produce markets not affected by stringency in Money market. Cotton firm with tendency to advance; Broad-stuffs not materially changed; Sugar declined £14 per ton. The Newmarket Races in England the Caesar-witch Stakes worth \$10,000 was won by American mare Priores; over 30 competitors. Telegraphic advices from India more favorable to English. Delhi remained in hands of insurgents, Aug. 30th, but mutineers had been defeated at all other points in several engagements. European news is devoid of interest.

B.S.") denoting that they are built experimentally, and are classed subject to being surveyed biennially by the Society's Surveyor. The following has been added as a foot-note to the Rules, Section 46, viz:—"Where thick garboard strakes are used they must be bolted horizontally through the keel and each other."
