

spices are to be removed from 50 per cent to the free list.

It is estimated that these changes will reduce the aggregate revenue to about twelve millions in all. Such multiplications will increase the strength of propositions before the House, being a compromise of extremes, especially as the iron, cotton, and manufacturing interests are mostly assailed.—New Brunswick.

The Mails across the Bay. We have had no communication with Digby, or the Western portion of Nova Scotia, for three or four weeks. The reason is, that the cold weather has frozen the packet schooner which carries the mails, in Digby Basin, and consequently there she has to remain until the ice runs. We think this state of things might be obviated by having the mails sent down to the entrance of the Gut, and a vessel ready there to receive them. We would recommend the government to take some steps in the matter, in order to obviate the present difficulty and prevent its recurrence in future.

Since writing the above, the packet with the mails on board has arrived here.

The Hon. Preston S. Brooks, U. S. Senator from South Carolina, died very suddenly at Washington on the 27th ult., of acute inflammation of the throat. He rendered himself noted during the last setting of Congress for a violent assault with a club on the Hon. Mr Sumner, Senator from Massachusetts, the details of which are no doubt fresh in the minds of many of our readers.
