PLOUGHING MATCH.

The Ploughing Match of the present year will be open to all who are Members of the Society, agreeably to the Rules; and it will consist of only one class of Ploughmen.

1st.—Teams must be on the ground by 10 and ready to commence work by 11 o'clock, A. M.

2nd.—No person shall be eligible to compete for a prize who has not been a Member of the Society at least one month previous to the day of competition.

3rd.—Three Judges will be appointed by the Board, and their name will be aumonaced by the Secretary on the morning of the Ploughing Match.

4th.—The Society will provide for the Ferryage of all Horses that have been actually engaged in the competion of the day.

6th.—No person shall be allowed to assist the ploughmen, or in any way interfere with, or
