NOTICE is hereby given, that a Red Light is now exhibited on the North East Point of Miscoe Island, in Latitude 48° 01' N, Longitude 64° 29' 28" W., as determined by Commander Oriabar, of the Admiralty Survey. It is 76 feet above high water, and can be seen in clear weather 12 miles—A Shoal extends 3 miles on a N. by E. compass bearing from the Light; but on other bearings the Light may be approached from the Eastward to within a mile from the shore.
