At a General Session of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, held at the Court House in Newcastle, in and for the County of Northumberland, on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven. ORDERED, That the following Rules and Regulations be made and established in pursuance of the authority vested in the General Sessions by the Revised Statutes, Cap. 64, "For the Regulation of the Fisheries, and of Seines, Nets, and Fish Weirs, within Rivers and Harbours," and in amendment of previous Regulations made by the Sessions of this County relative to the same.
