each, which took about \$0,000 quintals of codfish ; the number of fish to each vessel averag-ing quite 28,000, or 2,800,000 in all. The total value of the fish and oil is \$272,000; to which is to be added the bounty claimed, nearly \$28,000. It is supposed that Provincetewn vessels have caught more than half the codfish taken in the State during the year; but the Banner complains that it has received less bounty money than Marblehead or Gloucester.

New York, March 7.-Lord Napier, the new British Minister, was yesterday waited upon at the Clarendon by a deputation from the Chamber of Commerce, and warmly welcomed.

SWITZERLAND .- The Bund of Berne contains an article asserting the right of Switzerland to try the deserters of Neufchatel. The writer remarks that Switzerland has not renounced her jurisdiction even over the insurgents of Neufchatel; that she released them in virtue of her sovereign power, and not in recognition of that of Prussia over Neufchatel; and that the jurisdiction of the confederation over dethe jurisdiction of the confederation over de-serters cannot be for a moment doubted. The militia of Neufehatel have been bound to obey every requisition of the federal authorities since 1815, because from that period Neufeha-ter was a canton of Switzerland. The deser-ters arrested have been sent before the examination magistrate.
