3rd. All articles to be Exhibited, must have been manufactured, raised or produced within one year from the date of competition.

4th. All persons desirous to exhibit any article of Domestic Manufacture, Grain, Garden Seeds, or Dairy Produce, must accompany the same with a statement setting forth that the exhibitor is the owner of the article in question. If Domestic Manufactures, that the materials were produced, and the articles manufactured and prepared within the county during the past year. If Grains or Seed, that they were raised by the exhibitor on the premises occupied by him during the previous year, and were not exhibited for a premium at this Society's Shaw, on any former occasion. And if Dairy Produce, a similar statement subscribed by the owner. These certificates to be handed to the committee when the articles are present for competion.

5th. That no person who has been awarded the 1st prize for any article, shall be entitled to a second prize, for the same description of article. 6th. The Judge shall not withhold any premium onlithe ground that the article is unworthy 7th. All articles intended for exhibition to be deliver d into the handsot the Receiving Committee. on the morning of the Exhibition, by haf-past 9 o'clock, and none will be admitted after 10 o'clock. 8th.
