**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1st. No person of the Society one month prior to the day of Exhibition, shall be deemed eligible to compete for any prize offered by the Society.

2nd. No premium shall be awarded for any article of Domestic Manufacture of the Dairy Produce, raised within the County, which has not been wholly prepared for exhibition.

3rd. All articles to be exhibited must have been manufactured, raised, or produced, within one year from the date of competition.

4th. All persons desiring to exhibit any article of Domestic Manufacture or Dairy Produce, must accompany the same with a statement setting forth the name of the exhibitor, the name of the article, and the date of its manufacture, and the date of its production, and the date of its exhibition.

5th. That no person shall be entitled to a second prize, for any article, unless he has obtained a first prize for the same, on the ground that the article is unworthy of exhibition.

6th. All articles intended for exhibition, to be delivered into the hands of the receiving committee, on the morning of the Exhibition, by half-past 9 o'clock, and none will be admitted after 10 o'clock.

7th. No article of Grain or Seed, which has undergone any chemical, kiln, or fire-drying process, will receive a premium, or be allowed to enter for competition.
