All persons desirous to exhibit any article of Domestic Manufacture, Grains, Garden Seeds, or Dairy Produce, must accompany the same with a statement setting forth that the exhibitor is the owner of the article in question. If Domestic Manufactures, that the materials were produced, and the articles manufactured and prepared within the county during the past year. If Grains or Seed, that they were raised by the exaibitor on the premises occupied by him during the previous year, and were not exhibited for a promium at this Society's Show on any former occasion. And if Dairy Produce, a similar statement subscribed by the owner. These certificates to be handed to the committee when the articles are presented for competition.

5th. That no person who has been awarded the lot prize for any article, shall be entitled to a second prize, for the same description of article.

6th. The Judges shall not withhold any premium on the ground that the article is unworthy.

7th. All articles intended for exhibition to be devered into the hands of the Receiving Committee,

on the morning of the Exhibition, by half-past 9 o'clock, and none will be admitted after 10 o'clock. Sch. No erticle of Grain or Seed, which has undergone any chemical, kiln, or fire-drying process, will receive a premium, or be allowed to enter for competition.
