"The Market is still characterised by dullness and depression. New supplies coming to an already over-stocked market have been disposed of at a considerable reduction upon cost of import. The demand for consumption is languid, and purchasers have an impression that the supply in the early part of the season will be sufficient to keep prices very low."
