HAS APPROPRIATED

Eighty Pounds of its Funds

To the encouragement of the Fishery this Season, as follows:

MACKEREL FISHERY.

To the vessel that shall have caught the largest quantity of No. 1 and 2 Mackerel, over 50 barrels a 1st prize of £30
To the vessel that shall have caught the next largest quantity of No 1 and 2 Mackerel, over 30 barrels 2nd prize of £15
[These vessels to be actually engaged in the Mackerel Fishery, from the 1st day of August, till the 10th day of October next.]

A Bounty on Mackerel caught in Boats, under 15 Tons, [not in shore nets] to be paid at a uniform rate per barrel. The rate will depend upon the Season's catch, but it will not exceed 5s per barrel for No. 1 nor 2s 6d. for No. 2. Five Barrels will be the smallest quantity upon which any bounty will be paid.

FALL HERRING.

A Bounty will be paid at a uniform rate per barrel on No 1 Fall Herring, that shall have been caught during next Fall, in boats or vessels, fitted out in this country. The rate per barrel will depend on the Season's catch, but it will not exceed 3s per barrel. Ten Barrels will be the smallest quantity upon which any bounty will be paid.

A fuller detail of the conditions and regulations, under which the above bounties and prizes, will be awarded, will be found by referring, to the large Hand Bills, issued by the Society last year, dated 2nd June, 1857.
