REGULATION OF SESSION.

At a General Session of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden at the Court House in Newcastle, in and for the County of Northumberland, on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Eight, and in the Twenty-Second year of Her Majesty's Reign.

WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable with a view of encouraging the Trade of the River, and maintaining a connection by steam with other Ports, that any steamboat trading in, to, or from the Port of Miramichi, either as a Passenger Boat or otherwise, shall be exempt from the payment of Pilotage.

Therefore ordered, that any such boat, trading as aforesaid, shall be exempt from the Payment of Pilotage, while so employed.
