INACT to authorife the Juffices of the Selfions, in feveral Counties of this Province to make regulations for the weighing of HAY within fuch Counties where it may be found receffary to erect machines for that purpole. Paifed the 8th February, 1799.

I. BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council and Allembly, that from and after the paffing of this A&, the Juffices of the General Seffions of the Peace for the feveral Counties in this Province, except the County of St. John, be, and hereby are authorifed and empowered, if they think it, to creft, or give permission for crefting Michines for the weighing of Hay in fuch Town or Parish s they from sime to time shall think necessary, and o make and ordain fuch rules and regulations, and eftablifs fuch rates and allowances to the owners nd proprietors of the faid Hay Machines in their espective Counties as they may judge necessary for he better government and management of the fame ; nd that the faid Juffices shall and may affix such penalties not exceeding Ten Pounds, as they may think neceffary for the carrying into execution fuch rales and regulations, and for the establishing fuch rates and allowances fo by them to be made and established ; such penalties to be recovered on the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses, before any two of his Majefty's Juffices of the Peace for the County where the penalty shall be incurred, and to be levied by warrant of diffress and fale of the offender's goods, one half to the informer, and the other half to the ule of the Poor of the Town or Parish where the offence shall be committed.

### REGULATIONS.

At a Court of General Seffions of the Peace held at Fredericton, in and for the County of York, the 15th day of June, 1804.

PURSUANT to a Law of this Province paffed in

regulation shall continue and be in full force for Fourteen Years and no longer.—And the Court further ordain that the faid EDWARD WINSLOW MILLER do give Bord to the Treasurer of the County in the penal fum of Fifty Pounds for the due performance of this order, and that he also be bound to give the necessary attendance between the hours of Sustifing and Sunfetting, to carry the fame into effex.

I do therefore give public Notice, that I have at great expense erected a complete Machine for weighing of Hay, on a Lot on the Bank at Fredericton, affigned to me for that purpole by His Excellency the Governor in Council, and that I have given bond with fufficient fureties in the penal fum of Fifty Pounds for the due performance of the order, as by the faid Regulations is required. And I further give Notice, that, if after the day of the date hereof, any perfon or perfons schall prefume to fell or purchase any Load or Loads of Hay without weighing, contrary to the true intent and meaning of the faid Act and Regulations, they schall be profecuted as the law directs.
