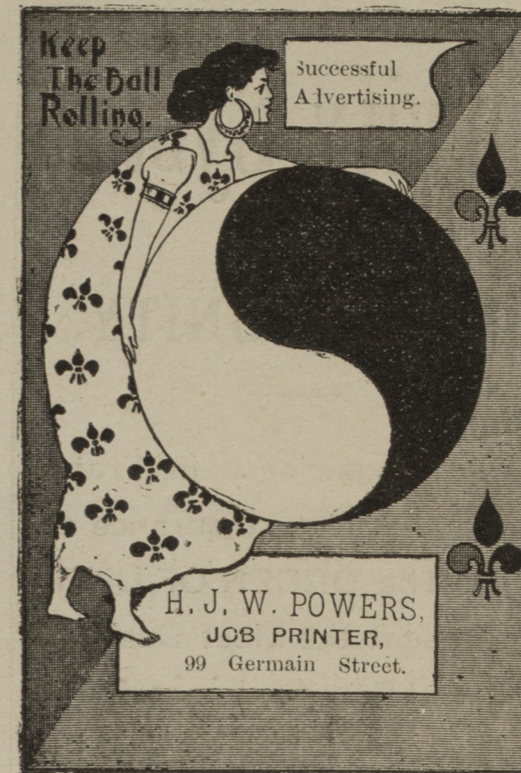
**Independent Order of Good Templars**
