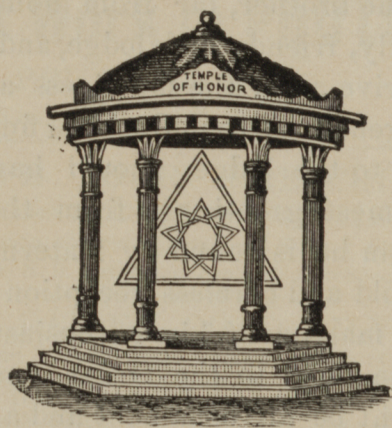

There is also an insurance department open to all under sixty years of age, who can pass a medical examination.
