**Canada Disgraced.**

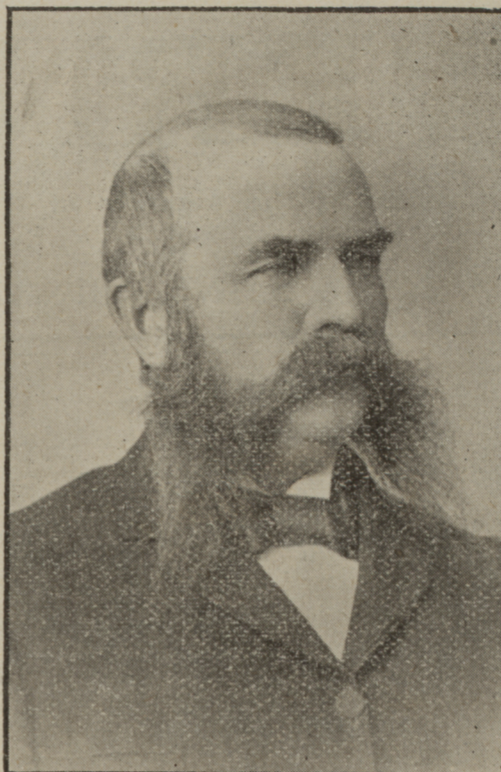
The Rev. Dr. Mackay, of Wood stock, a veteran temperance crusader has boldly denounced from the pulpit the bar-room at Ottawa, and the drunkenness of the House of Commons. He has been fiercely assailed for this statement, but in a communication to the public press, he affirms its truthfulness as follows:

The existence of a "bar-room" in our House of Commons. will not be denied by any one. It is not, however, generally known that it is an unlicensed place, carried on at the expense of the country, and conducted in a way that would disgrace any ordinary bar-room in the land. Some time the Ottawa Journal accused this bar of "sending many a man to the devil." and demanded that it should be abolished; this week the same paper has an editorial on the subject in which it says: "Undoubtedly the bar, as at present abused, is a Parliamentary discredit, and the members should at least set their faces to the creation of a resolute Parliamentary opinion against the habit of tipping there."

I have been fiercely assailed because I dared charge some members of Parliament with drunkenness in the House. I am sorry I cannot retract one sentence, word or syllable of what I said. Names and dates can be given, and eyewitnesses can be produced at the proper time and place. We need not go very far back for illustrations. Here is a paragraph from the Montreal Witness of last Wednesday: "While Col. O'Brien was speaking, a member sat near him, helplessly drunk, and smoking a cigar. He had been up all night and had taken whiskey to keep alive." No wonder that in such a condition, while some members are speaking in the House, others are spinning rattles; others fast asleep and snoring loudly; others calling each other "political blackguards" and "irresponsibles."—Onward.
