**The Insurrection at Tortula.**—A Spanish steamer from Porto Rico, via St. Thomas, arrived at New York on Sunday last. She brought a St. Thomas Times of the 10th of August, which confirms the rumour of the insurrection at Tortula. 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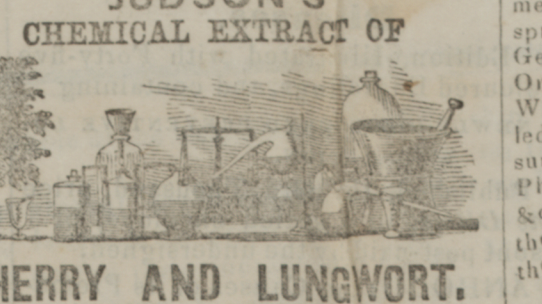

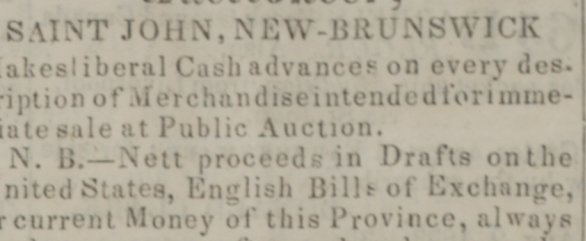
