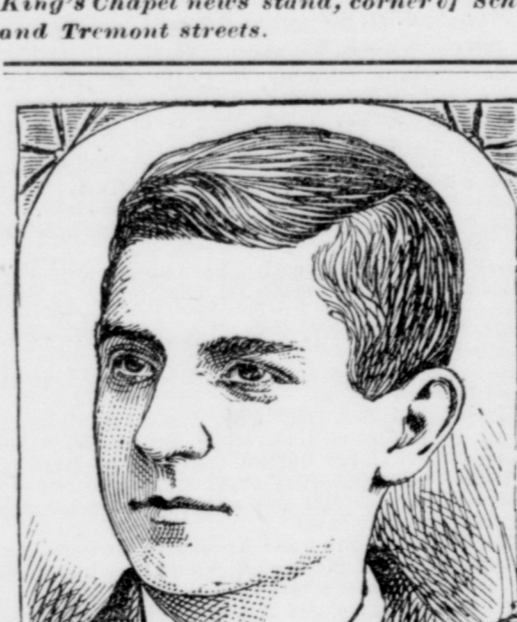
WESTFIELD.

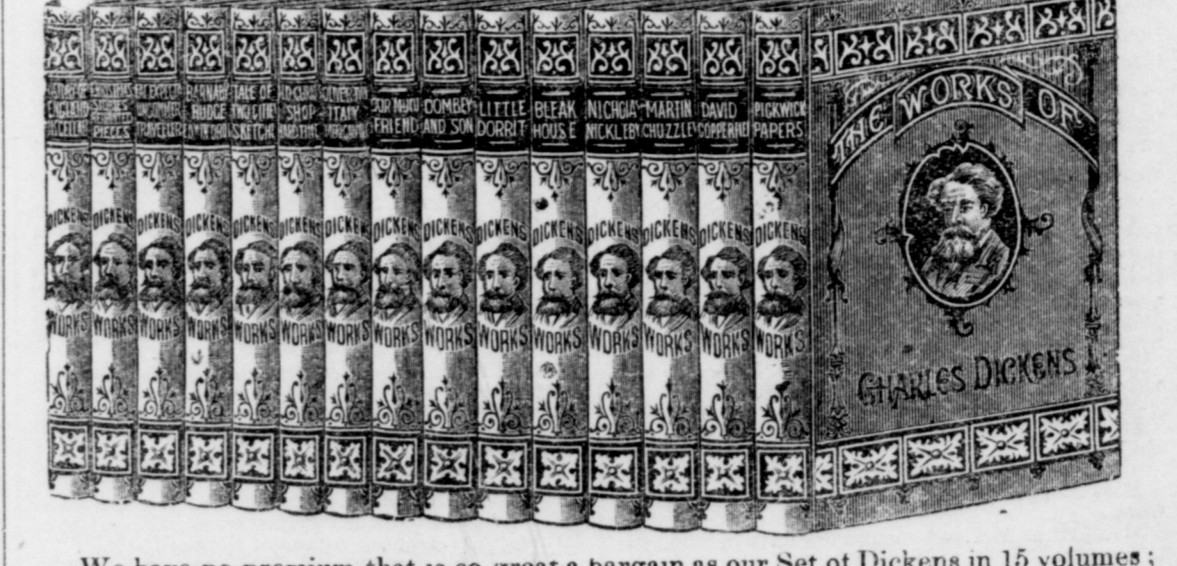
