ICEBREAKER A FAILURE.

Tee Great Yermark Unable to Force its way Through the Kara Sea.

The great Russian icebreaker Yermak. with Admiral Makaroff on toard, has returned to Tromsoe, North Norway, after endeavoring in vain to force its way through the ice of the Kara sea to the mouth fof the Yenisei river, Siberia, says the New York Sun. Its purpose was to steam around the north end of the Novoya Z m'is and break its way hough the ice of the Kara sea to the Yepisei. It was found, however that the ice of the Kara sea was too beavy to be broken by the Yermak, in spite of the great weight and powerful machinery of that vessel.

The failure of the Yermak to carry out Adu M fi lans tor last summers work disposes of the scheme, in which he has reposed much faith, of finally settling the question of the north nole by making a journey to it on his ice breaker. He has repeatedly expressed his confidence that the Yermak could break a road through any Arctic ice, and he proposed to command the ship on a voyage to the pole.

The failure of the Yermak this year, bowever, proves the impracticability of his scheme, as far as the Yermak, at least, is concerned. It is possible for an ice breaker to force its way to the north pole the achievement can be accomplished only by a vessel that is heavier and more powertul than the Yermak

This great ship, however, has abundantly proved its usefulness for commercial purposes. The vessel was built to break up the ice of the Baltic so as to give ships access to Russian ports and rivers at times when they are usually closed by ice. In March, 1898, the Yermak, tresh from the shipyards where it was built, entered the frez n port of Kronstadt with comparaive ease, and then going to R vel liberated 33 vessels of a value of \$7,500,000, so that they were able to go on their way with cargoes. Then returning to Kronstadt and St. Petersburg the Yermak opened the way for the entrance of 40 steamers several weeks before the ordi-

In 1899, the Yermak was subjected to still severer tests She went to Spitzbergen about the close of the season of navigation pushed into the polar ice and made a journey through the pack ice. She travelled in the pack about 230 miles. Her powerful machinery drove her bow far up on tho i a that was 14 feet thick. Invariably the great weight of the vessel broke the ice and the Yermak went on its way at an average speed of three to four knots an hour. Such work ss this makes ice breaking in the Baltic, where the ice is not likely to exceed five feet in "thickness, mere child's play. There is no doubt that the Yermak is more than able to cope with any ice that is ever met in the Baltic.

The result of this severe polar test con firmed Admiral Mackaroff in his opinion that the Yermak would be able to cope with any ice in the Arctic regions. The result of this year's work, hawever, shows that he underestimated the thickness and toughness of portions of the polar pack. The Yermak is never likely to be of much service in the field of exploration,


