For the benefit of those concerned, and at the request of a number of respectable citizens, we print the following notification.

OFFICE OF AMERICAN CLAIMS, HALIFAX, Nova-Scotia, 15th Nov. 1785.

WHEREAS an act passed during the last session of Parliament for appointing commissioners further to enquire into the losses and services of all such persons who have suffered in their rights, properties and professions during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their loyalty to His Majesty and attachment to the British government; and whereas Col. THOMAS DUNDAS and J. PEMBERTON, Esq; two of the commissioners appointed by the said act were thereby directed to repair to Nova-Scotia, or any other of His Majesty's Colonies in America, to enquire into such claims. NOTICE is hereby given, that the said commissioners have arrived at Halifax, and intend to proceed forthwith at that place to make their enquiries into the claims already preferred, and to receive and enquire into such new claims as shall be preferred before the 1st of May 1786, in manner hereafter mentioned.

As to those claims which have been preferred under the former act of Parliament, the said commissioners mean to enquire into them regularly, in such order as the same were received and stand entered in the office of American claims in England; of which all persons resident in or near Halifax may be informed, by enquiry at the office there, and the same information will be communicated by the commissioners to the Governor, or chief officer in every other part of His Majesty's colonies in America, to the intent, that all persons interested, by application to such governor or chief officer, may know the order in which such claims will be investigated. It must however be understood, that the personal attendance of every claimant at the time his claim is examined into will be indispensably required.

In respect to the said former claims, it is required by the said commissioners, that a duplicate or at least an account of the nature and extent of such claim formerly delivered, and the names of the witnesses intended to be produced in support of it, be transmitted with the utmost possible expedition to Peter Hunter, Esq; secretary to the commissioners at the office of American claims at Halifax.

And whereas by the said act, time has been allowed to the 1st day of May, 1786, for new claims to be preferred by persons who shall upon oath prove to the satisfaction of the commissioners, that they were absent from the Kingdoms of Great-Britain and Ireland, and by unavoidable accident or particular circumstances were utterly incapable of preferring their claims during the time allowed by the former act. NOTICE is hereby given, that it is expected by the said commissioners that on the delivery of every such new claim, an affidavit be made in the following form:

"A. B. I, of but now of make oath and faith, that he resided from the 15th of July 1783, to the 25th of March 1784, and this deposition further faith, that he was utterly incapable of preferring or delivering to the commissioners appointed by act of Parliament passed in the 33d year of the reign of His present Majesty, entitled, 'an act for appointing commissioners to enquire into the losses and services of all such persons who have suffered in their rights, properties and professions during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their loyalty to His Majesty, and attachment to the British government.' Or at their office, any memorial, claim or request for aid or relief on account of this dependent's losses during the late unhappy dissensions in America, within the time allowed by the said act, for the receiving of such claims, to wit: that this dependent during all that time, viz. between the 15th of July,

1783, and the 25th of March 1784, lived "or resided at "And (here state the particular circumstances "on which proceeded the delivery of the "claim."

N. B. Persons residing in or near Halifax may make oath to their affidavits before the commissioners; persons residing at any other part of His Majesty's colonies, before the Governor, or any one of the Council of the province, or chief magistrate of the place wherein such claimant resides.

All new claims accompanied by an affidavit made pursuant to the above form (if the facts and circumstances stated in such affidavit appear to be sufficient,) which shall be preferred before the 1st of May 1786, will be received by the said commissioners subject however, as to the facts and circumstances stated in such new claim, as well, as in such affidavit, to future enquiry and consideration on the personal examination of the claimant.

And the said commissioners give further notice, that they mean in the first place to finish their enquiry into the claims formerly preferred, and then to proceed to the examination of such new claims as shall be received before the 1st of May 1786, and endeavors will be used, that such new claimants shall receive the earliest information of the time and order in which their respective claims will be investigated.
