A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by a proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March 1785 permission was given to all loyalists residing in the United States of America to transport themselves with their effects to this province in any vessels, and whereas sufficient time has been allowed for persons of the above description to avail themselves thereof: I publish this proclamation by and with the advice of His Majesty's council, for the information of those whom the same may concern, hereby declaring that the permissions contained in the said proclamation shall from henceforth cease and determine and that in future every vessel which shall on any pretence whatever, enter the ports or harbours of this province, and be unfurnished with a legal register, or shall not be navigated according to law, will be deemed subject to forfeiture and be seized accordingly.

Given under my hand and seal at the City of Saint John, this second day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six, and in the twenty sixth year of His Majesty's reign.
