GENERAL-POST-OFFICE, ST. JOHN, 8th May, 1787.

THE General-Post-Office of this Province is removed to the House lately occupied by *George Spry, Esq.* the Corner of King and Germain Streets.

Letters will be delivered at the Office windows every day of the week, Sundays excepted, from 9 o'clock in the morning until 3 in the afternoon. A letter box is fixed in the corner window facing Germain Street, for the reception of letters to be forwarded in the King's mails.—Ship letters, &c. received at the door in King Street, at all hours.

A mail carrier being appointed some time since, to carry the mails from this office to and from Fredericton once a fortnight, he sets out from this office on every intervening Wednesday, precisely at nine o'clock in the morning, and leaves the Post-Office at Fredericton on the Wednesday following at the same hour, and so alternately until further orders.—This appointment being absolutely necessary to complete the chain of communication between Queen and Halifax, and being attended with considerable expense, the public are therefore once more notified that the private delivery of all letters will be discontinued, and the laws relating to the post thereof, duly enforced.

N. B. The mail carrier will set out from this office at Fredericton on Wednesday, the 23d instant.
