A PROCLAMATION.

THOMAS CARLETON.

H E R E A S

His Majesty was pleased in Council on the 8th of April 1785 to regulate the commerce between the subjects of His Majesty's dominions and the inhabitants of the United States of America; AND WHEREAS the State of cultivation in that part of the province of NEW-BRUNSWICK renders it necessary further to continue the permission in that respect given for a limited time by my Proclamation published on the 10th of July last: I have therefore thought fit in and with the advice of His Majesty's Council to publish this Proclamation and do in pursuance of the powers given me by the said regulations hereby allow and permit horses, neat cattle, sheep, pigs, poultry, and all other species of live stock and the provisions, peas, beans, potatoes, wheat, rye, bread, biscuit, rice, oats, barley, and all other species of grain, to be imported by British vessels from any of the United States of America into the ports of this province in British built vessels owned by his Majesty's subjects; and navigating according to law for and during the term of six months commencing from the date of these pre- sent. And of this proclamation and permission all persons whom it may concern will take due notice and strictly conform thereto.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton this tenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven and the twenty seventh year of his Majesty's reign.
