B O S T O N, June 25.

FRIDAY a bill was read 3 times and passed to be engrossed, in the Hon. House of Representatives, in continuing until the first of January next, the order act, (so called) passed by the General Court last year, and which expires in July next. The bill passed by a majority of 141 to 32. In the Senate, the report of the Committee of a bill for that purpose was read and not accepted.

The committee, raised by the Hon. House of Representatives, to fix on a suitable place in the country, as the seat of government, Friday reported to the House in favour of Concord, in the county of Middlesex.

Thursday next, we hear, is appointed for the execution of Job Shattuck, at Concord, who was lately convicted of treason.

The Philadelphia papers are crowded with observations on that important subject upon which the Federal Convention, are now debating.

One of these paragraphists observes—Such circumspection and secrecy mark the proceedings of the Federal Convention, that the members find it difficult to acquire the habit of communication even themselves, and are so cautious in defeating the curiosity of the public, that all debate is suspended upon the entrance of their own inferior officers. Though we readily admit the propriety of excluding an indiscriminate attendance upon the discussions of this deliberative council, it is hoped that the privacy of their transactions will be an additional motive for dispatch, as the anxiety of the people must be necessarily increased, by every appearance of mystery in conducting this important business.

W O R C E S T E R, June 28.

On Thursday, last week, Henry Gale, late prisoner in goal in this town, under sentence of death for Treason, was carried to a gallows erected on the common, and there reprieved to the second day of August next.

We hear from Sterling, that on Monday the 18th instant, the people of that town killed 3087 birds of prey.

Extract of a letter from a gentleman in one of the Western Counties.

"You will undoubtedly have heard before this reaches you, that Parmenter and M'Culloch, two of the prisoners in Northampton goal, (under sentence of death) were last Thursday reprieved at the gallows, until the 2d of August next—that is, respite; to the great mortification, chagrin and disappointment of the friends of government, and the joy, exultation, and insulting triumph of those in the part of the insurgents. What the consequence will be is impossible to say; I hope not so bad as some prognosticate. We live in a new world in every sense of the word. The Days have returned home in triumph, wearing their side arms; and behaving very insolently as they passed along. In short, the measures of the present administration have reversed the feelings of the people in this country.—But no more on politics."

Extract of a letter from a gentleman in Berkshire county, dated Jan 20, 1787.

"Depredation on the property and persons of those who unfortunately have been friends to government in these counties are nightly committed. We have frequent instances of persons being violently attacked and beaten on the roads while they are journeying in a peaceable manner; in short, we are exposed to all the evils of a depredatory civil war. The insurgents plume themselves on having many friends in the government—and indeed those who are opposed to them think they have every thing to fear. God grant that their fears may not
