An Act for appointing Commissioners further to enquire into the losses and services of all such persons who have suffered in their Rights, Properties, and professions, during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their Loyalty to his Majesty, and attachment to the British Government.

WHEREAS by an act, made in the twenty-third year of the reign of his present Majesty, intitled, An act for appointing Commissioners to enquire into the Losses and services of all such persons who have suffered in their rights, properties and professions, during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their loyalty to his Majesty and attachment to the British Government, and also by two several acts, made in the twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth years of the reign of his present Majesty, certain persons were constituted Commissioners for enquiring into the respective losses and services of all such person and persons who have suffered in their rights, properties, and professions, during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their loyalty to his Majesty and attachment to the British Government: And whereas the purposes intended by the said acts are not yet completed, and it is therefore necessary that the said acts should be further continued; be it therefore enacted by the

Kings most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that John Wilmot, Esq. Colonel Robert Kingdon, Colonel Thomas Dundas, John Marth, Esquire, Jeremy Pemberton, Esquire, and Robert Mackenzie, Esquire, shall be, and they are hereby constituted Commissioners for the purposes in the said recited acts mentioned.

II. And be it further enacted, that any two of them the said John Wilmot, Colonel Robert Kingdon, John Marth, and Robert Mackenzie, before they enter upon the execution of this act, shall take an oath before the master of the Rolls for the time being, or one of his Majesty's justices of the Court of Kings Bench, Common Pleas, or Barons of the Exchequer, (which they or either of them are hereby authorized and required to administer), in the form following; that is to say,

I, A. B. do swear, that, according to the best of my skill and knowledge, I will faithfully, impartially, and truly execute the several powers and trusts vested in me by an act, intituled, An act for appointing Commissioners further to enquire into the losses and services of all such persons who have suffered in their rights, properties, and professions, during the late unhappy dissensions in America, in consequence of their loyalty to his Majesty, and attachment to the British Government, according to the tenor and purport of the said act.

And every other of them the said John Wilmot, Colonel Robert Kingdon, John Marth, and Robert Mackenzie, shall likewise take the same oath before the said two Commissioners, who are hereby authorized and required to administer the same, after they shall themselves have taken the said oath as aforesaid.

III. And be it further enacted, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Commissioners, or any two or more of them, and they are hereby authorized, empowered, and required, to examine upon oath (which oath they, or any two or more of them, are hereby authorized to administer), all persons whom the said Commissioners, or any two or more of them, shall think fit to examine, touching all such matters and things as shall be necessary for the execution of the powers vested in the said Commissioners by this act; and all such persons are hereby directed and required punctually to attend the said Commissioners at such time or place as they or any two or more of them, shall appoint.

IV. And be it enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the said Commissioners, or any two or more of them, are hereby authorized to meet and sit, from time to time, at their present place of meeting, or at such other place as they, or any two or more of them, shall think proper, with or without adjournment, and to send their precept or precepts, under their hands and seals, for any person or persons whatsoever, and for such books, papers, writings, or records, as they shall judge necessary for their information in the execution of the powers vested in the said Commissioners by this act; and the said Commissioners, or any two or more of them, are hereby authorized to appoint and employ such Clerks, Messengers, and Officers as they shall think meet, and to give to every of the said Clerks and Officers an oath for his true and faithful demeanor, in all things relating to the due performance of the trust reposed in him by the said Commissioners, and in all other things touching the premises; which Clerks and Officers are hereby required faithfully to execute and perform the trust in them severally and respectively reposed, without taking any thing for such their service, other than such
