To SHIPBUILDERS, &c.

At a meeting of the principal Shipwrights held at the City of St. John, on the 11th inst. for the purpose of regulating working hours, agreeable to the rules established in Great Britain, and the neighbouring Provinces.—Resolved, that the hours for one day's work shall be TEN, to begin at six in the morning and leave off at six in the evening—allowing three quarters of an hour at breakfast, and one hour and a quarter at dinner—that when the short day's will not admit, the wages to be reduced accordingly. That in Graving, &c. every tide, will be considered a day's work.

They flatter themselves their employers will be better satisfied by the preceding Resolves.
