A PROCLAMATION.
HEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Province stands prorogued to the Second Tuesday of this inst. May, I have therefore thought fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the Second TUESDAY in AUGUST next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the Thirteenth day of May, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-Nine, & in the Thirty-Ninth Year of our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.
WHEREAS it is necessary from public emergency and to prevent distress to the settlers in this Province, that the importation of the following articles should be authorized and permitted for the supply of the inhabitants for a longer time; I have therefore thought fit by and with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Council, to publish this Proclamation, and by virtue of the power and authority granted to me in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the twenty eighth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America and in the West-India Islands and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West-Indies."—I do hereby authorize and permit Wheat, Rye, Rice, or Indian Corn and the Flour of Wheat or Rye, and also Ash Oar Rafter and Capstand Bars to be imported by British Subjects in British built ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects and navigated according to law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of six months from the date hereof, and of this Proclamation all persons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the first day of July, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Nine, and in the Thirty Ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign.
