A PROCLAMATION.

BY Virtue of the Power and Au-  
thority granted to me, in and by  
an Act of Parliament made and passed  
in the Twenty-eighth year of His MAJES-  
TY'S Reign, intituled, "An Act for re-  
gulating the Trade between the Subjects  
of His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plan-  
tations in North-America and in the  
West India Islands and the Countries  
belonging to the United States of Ame-  
rica, and between His MAJESTY'S said  
Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the  
West-Indies"—I do, by and with the  
advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S  
Council, publish this Proclamation,  
herby authorizing and permitting  
Wheat, Rye, Rice or Indian Corn, and  
the Flour of Wheat or Rye—also Ash  
Oar-Rafters and Capstan Bars, Staves,  
Heading and Treennails, to be imported  
by British Subjects in British built ships,  
owned by His MAJESTY'S Subjects,  
and navigated according to Law, from  
any of the Territories belonging to the  
United States of America, for and dur-  
ing the term of Six Months from this  
date—and of this Proclamation all Per-  
sons whom it may concern will take due  
notice and govern themselves accord-  
ingly. Given under my Hand and Seal  
at Fredericton, the first day  
of January, in the Year of  
our Lord, one thousand eight  
hundred and one, and in the  
forty-first year of His MAJES-  
TY'S Reign.

By His EXCELLENCY'S Command,  
JON. ODELL.

An Act for the further and better sup-  
port of the Poor in the City of Saint  
John.

It is Enacted by the Lieutenant  
Governor, Council and Assem-  
bly, That the Mayor, Aldermen and  
Commonalty in the City of Saint John  
be, and they are hereby authorized, year-  
ly and every year during the continu-  
ance of this Act, to lay a Tax upon  
Dogs; to be levied upon the owners  
of the same living within the limits of  
the said City, and collected in such  
manner as the Corporation of the said  
City by law or ordinance shall appoint:  
which said Tax shall be appropriated  
and applied for the support of the Poor,  
and to no other purpose whatsoever.  
Provided that such Tax shall not amount  
to more than five shillings for any one  
Dog.

II. And be it further enacted, That  
this Act shall continue and be in force  
for five years and no longer.
