LONDON, May 8.

The masked Prisoner of State, lately embarked at Cadiz, was, it is now reported, the unfortunate Don Urquijo. Many of our readers will recollect, that this Nobleman resided, for a considerable period, in this country, as Ambassador from the court of Madrid. His offence is said to have been an attempt to abridge the power of the Inquisition. He is now to be transported to one of the Philippine Islands, there to remain in close confinement for life. A number of his friends have also become victims to their zealous co-operation with

him in promoting the cause of humanity. Among these is the learned Jovelanus, who, it appears, had expressed his sentiments with too much freedom, in a memorial which he drew up, at the express request of the Government, on the best means for ameliorating the internal organization of the Spanish Monarchy.

A most horrible transaction took place lately at Rosetta. Several unfortunate girls, natives of the country, to the number of about 30, who had been kept by English officers and others, were at the moment of being deserted by their lovers, murdered in cold blood by the Turks, and their bodies thrown into the Nile. A similar act was perpetrated at Cairo, when that place was evacuated by the French, and it is feared that many wretched females at Alexandria will share the same fate on the departure of the English troops.
