

which persons, so chosen and appointed by you, shall be, to all intents and purposes, Counsellors in our said Province, until either they shall be confirmed by us, or that, by the nomination of others by us, under our Sign Manual and Signet, our said Council shall have or more persons in it.

"And we do hereby give and grant unto you full power and authority, with the advice and consent of our said Council, from time to time as need shall require, to summon and call General Assemblies of the said Freeholders and Planters within your government, according to the usage of our Province of F—. And our will and pleasure is, that the persons thereupon duly elected by the major part of the Freeholders of the respective Counties and places, and so returned, shall, before their sitting, take the oaths mentioned in the said Acts:—as also, make and subscribe the afore-mentioned declaration (which oaths and declaration you shall commissionate fit persons, under our Seal of F—, to tender and administer unto them): and until the same shall be so taken and subscribed, no person shall be capable of sitting, though elected.

"And we do hereby declare, that the persons so elected and qualified shall be called and deemed The General Assembly of that our Province, and the territories depending thereon.

"And you the said A. B. by and with the consent of our said Council and Assembly, or the major part of them respectively shall have full power and authority to make, constitute, and ordain laws, statutes, and ordinances, for the public peace, welfare, and good government of our said Province, and of the people and inhabitants thereof, and such others as shall resort thereto, and for the benefit of us, our heirs and successors: which said laws, statutes and ordinances, are not to be repugnant, but as near as may be agreeable to the laws and statutes of this our kingdom of Great-Britain.

"Provided that all such laws, statutes and ordinances, of what nature or duration soever, be, within three months or sooner after the making thereof, transmitted unto us under our Seal of F—, for our approbation or disallowance of the same; as also duplicates thereof by the next conveyance.

"And in case any or all of the said laws, statutes, and ordinances, being not before confirmed by us, shall at any time be disallowed, and not approved, and so signified by us, our heirs or successors, under our or their Sign Manual and Signet, or by order of our or their Privy Council, unto you the said A. B. or to the Commander in Chief of our said Province for the time being; then such and so many of the said laws statutes and ordinances, as shall be so disallowed, and not approved, shall from thenceforth cease, determine, and become utterly void and of none effect; any thing to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

"And, to the end that nothing may be passed or done by our said Council or Assembly, to the prejudice of us, our heirs or successors, we will and ordain, that you the said A. B. shall have and enjoy a negative voice in the making and passing of all laws, statutes and ordinances, as aforesaid: and you shall and may likewise, from time to time, as you shall judge it necessary, adjourn, prorogue, and dissolve all General Assemblies as aforesaid.

"And our further will and pleasure is, that you shall and may use and keep the Public Seal of our said Province of F—, for sealing all things whatsoever that pass the Great Seal of our said Province under your government.

"And we do further give and grant unto you the said A. B. full power and authority from time to time, and at any time hereafter, by yourself, or by any other to be authorized by you in that behalf, to administer, and give the oaths mentioned in the said Acts to all and every such person and persons as you shall think fit, who shall at any time or times pass into our said Province, or shall be resident or abiding there.

"And we do further by these presents give and grant unto you the said A. B. full power and authority, with the advice and consent of our said Council, to erect, constitute, and establish such and so many Courts of Judicature and public Justice, within our said Province under your government, as you and they shall think fit and necessary for the hearing and determining of all causes, as well criminal as civil, according to law and equity, and for a-

warding execution thereupon; with all reasonable and necessary powers, authorities, fees and privileges belonging thereunto; as also, to appoint and commissionate fit persons in the several parts of your government, to administer the oaths mentioned in the aforesaid Act, as also to tender and administer the aforesaid declaration, unto such persons belonging to the said Courts, as shall be obliged to take the same.

War-Office, March 24.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint General His Royal Highness EDWARD Duke of Kent, to be Governor of Gibraltar, vice General Chas. O'Hara, deceased.

PORTSMOUTH, March 23.

A sailor who was going through the Point Gates this morning was recognized by the ship's Steward, late of the Herminie, as one of the ringleaders in the mutiny on board that ship. He was accordingly secured and taken to the Main-Guard-House, when he confessed to several officers that he was the person that killed Capt. Pigot, and afterwards threw him overboard. He is a very young man, and was the gunner's servant at the time of the mutiny. He now belongs to the Bittern sloop of war, and has been employed five years in the Captain's boat of that ship, during which time he has behaved himself extremely well.

The four missing companies of the 26th or Cameronian regiment of foot, which parted company in a violent gale of wind in the Straits, and bore away for Malta, arrived at Plymouth on Sunday in the Donnegal transport. They landed at Catdown, and were received with the loudest acclamations, and escorted by hundreds of spectators to Frankfort Barracks, and the band and drums beating and playing several popular tunes.
