

NEW-YORK, October 30.

Capt. Mather, from Cape-Francois, informs that the fever had subsided in a small degree at the Cape; that the Negroes were gaining a little on the French army; that scarcely a day passed without some of the plantations being set fire to; that the discharge of guns could be distinctly heard at the Cape every day between the French and Negroes; and that no reinforcements had lately arrived from France; but a large force was hourly expected.—Pork, Beef and Flour were in demand, and bore a good price—Flour from 9 to 10 dollars per barrel—Pork, from 20 to 21—Beef, 15—Lumber, 16 dollars per 1000 feet.

Intelligence reached Cape Francois, on the 5th of October, that serious disturbances had broke out at Jeremie; that even plantations were already destroyed by fire, and that the insurrection was very extensive.

Extract of a letter from Cape-Francois, dated October, received by the Schooner Determined Rover.

"All importations now pay a duty of 10 per cent. on a Tariff, to be regulated every 3 months by the Prefect. Of the prohibition that has taken place lately, you must have a knowledge: we therefore shall say nothing on that head.

"The impositions lately put on the merchants, are scarcely supportable: they were all taxed a few days since 700 dollars for the term, it is said, of six months; and at the expiration of that time to be as much more."

Capt. FLINT of Yarmouth, (N. S.) reports, that on Thursday the 4th inst. he saw a Brig which he considered to be a new vessel, upset off Cape Forchu, and that the Inhabitants of that place had sent a vessel after the wreck—he does not know what success they had—she was off Cranberry head, to the Northward of the Cape.

The Brig in Cranberry head Cove, near Cape Forchu, appears to be new and lately graved—She has the head of her Main-Mast broken off and appears to be hanging by her rigging—has a new piece of sheathing on her starboard side and the lead on her Stem newly put on.—It is further said that she had been taken within the Cape.

RYAN, THERE having appeared in your Gazette of the 22d ult. a Caution under the signature of Nathan Frink, relating to certain Bills of Exchange drawn by Andrew Thompson & Co. on Thompson, Still & Co. and said to be drawn in my name, contrary to his (Nathan Frink's) express orders, and detained by me, as well as 1274 1/2 Guilders unaccounted for, in a voyage to Demarara.

As the whole of the above Caution, Sir, is a base fabrication, calculated to injure my character, as well as to answer some other of Capt. Frink's private ends, it will be necessary that I inform you, with respect to the Bill, that Mr. Andrew Thompson & Co. absolutely refused to draw in favour of any one but the person with whom he transacted the business, and that the Bill would never have been detained from Capt. Frink a single instant, had he been willing to come to that fair and equitable settlement I had a right to expect.

The 1274 1/2 Guilders which he says are unaccounted for, are the amount of three notes, left with Mr. Abijah Sherman of St. Andrews, to collect, with orders to remit the same to him as soon as collected, and for which I produced him Mr. Sherman's receipt.

Upon a fair statement of the Accounts between him and me (part of which was settled by Arbitration) there is a balance due from me of £ 107 : 14 : 5 1/2 and which was tendered him by my Attorney, in a Bill at 8 days Sight on HUGH JOHNSTON, Esquire, of this City, and indorsed by Daniel Grant, which he refused to accept.

It has always been my earnest wish to settle with Capt. Frink, agreeable to the strictest honor and justice, and which might have been easily accomplished, the Accounts being perfectly clear, had he not unfortunately been possessed with that litigious spirit which always has led him as it now does, to fish in troubled water.
