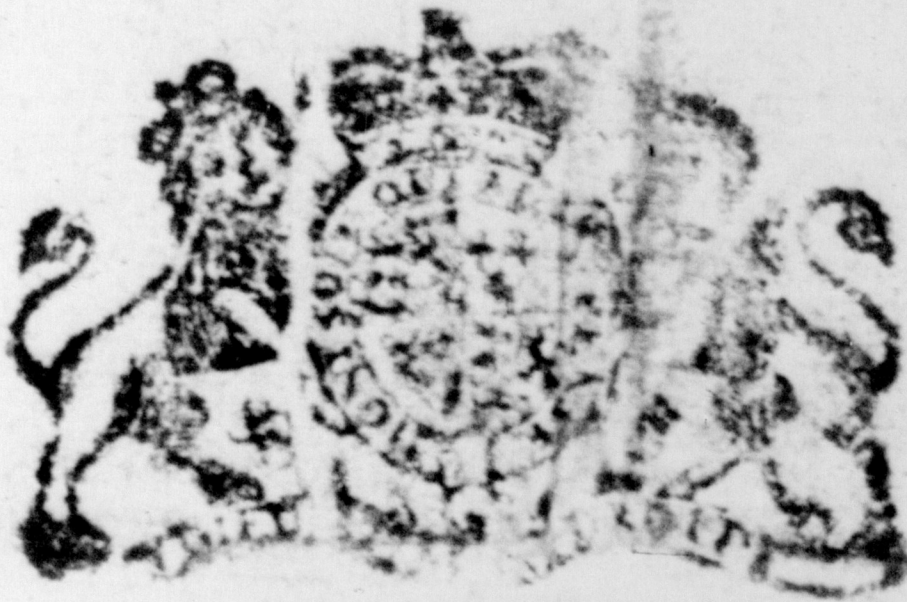

A LAW for the more effectually guarding against the introduction of Infectious Distempers into the City of Saint John.

BE it enacted by the Mayor, Aldermen and Assistants of the City of St. John, in Common Council convened, That from and after the passing of this Law, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons whomsoever to go on board any vessel coming from any place infected with the Yellow Fever, Putrid Billious Fever, or other contagious Distemper whatsoever, or having on board any person ill of the Yellow Fever, Putrid Billious Fever or other contagious Distemper whatsoever, (the Physician appointed by the Common Council to visit such vessels under the Act of Assembly to prevent bringing Infectious Distempers into the City of St. John, only excepted,) until such vessels shall have been duly examined according to Law, and shall have received licence from the Mayor, Aldermen and Recorder of the said City, or any two of them as the Law directs, for anchoring in the Harbour of St. John further from the Sea than opposite Pagan's Point, under the penalty of Five Pounds.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That in case any person or persons other than the Physician aforesaid, shall go on board any such vessel as is described in the foregoing Section contrary to the true intent and meaning thereof, that then it shall be the duty of the master of such vessel, or the commander of the same for the time being, to keep and detain such person or persons on board the said vessel, until licence as mentioned in the said Act of Assembly shall be obtained—and in case such licence shall be denied until the said vessel shall have ridden quarantine for such time as the said Mayor, Recorder and Aldermen of the City of St. John, or the major part of them shall direct and appoint; and in case the master or commander for the time being of any such vessel,

shall permit any such person or persons to come on board as aforesaid, contrary to the regulations in the first Section in this Act, (other than the Physician aforesaid) he shall forfeit and pay for each and every person so coming on board as aforesaid, the sum of Ten Pound; and in case after any such person or persons shall come on board as aforesaid, contrary to the true intent and meaning of the first Section of this Act, then if the master or commander of such vessel shall suffer or permit any such person or persons so coming on board as aforesaid, after they are once on board to come on shore or depart from the vessel, until such licence shall have been obtained as beforementioned, (or if licence shall be denied) until such Quarantine as shall be ordered as aforesaid, shall be expired, then such master or commander of such vessel for the time being, shall for every such person so permitted to go on shore as aforesaid, forfeit and pay the sum of Fifty Pounds.

And be it further enacted, That all masters shall be answerable for their apprentices, and parents for their children, and if any apprentice or apprentice, child or children under age, shall offend against this Law, the penalty for such child or children, apprentice or apprentices under age, offending as aforesaid, shall be levied on the master or parents of such apprentices or children respectively as the case may be.

Read and passed into a Law the 15th Sept. 1798.

THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR is pleased to direct the Twenty-second section of "an Act for the better regulating the MILITIA in New-Brunswick" to be published in the public Newspapers of the Province, in order that no person may plead ignorance; And His EXCELLENCY requests the respective Brigadiers to give the necessary orders to the commanding Officers of the Regiments under their command to be particular in enforcing the same where it may be found necessary.

"AND be it further enacted, That if in case of any emergency, any arms or accoutrements shall be furnished to any person belonging to the Militia in this Province, by Government, by reason that such person shall not have had it in his power before that time to have provided the same for himself; if in any such case any person so furnished with arms or accoutrements by Government shall sell or dispose of the same or any part thereof, or shall convey or cause the same or any part thereof to be conveyed out of the Province, or shall convey or cause the same or any part thereof to be conveyed on board any boat, ship or vessel with intent to have the same carried out of the Province, every person so offending, shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay the sum of Ten Pounds, to be recovered upon conviction before any one Justice of the Peace upon the oath of one or more credible witness or witnesses, and levied by warrant of distress and sale of the offender's goods, rendering the overplus if any, after deducting the costs and charges of such distress and sale, to the offender, one half of which penalties shall be to the use of the Poor of the town or parish where the offence shall be committed, the other half to the person who shall prosecute for the same; and for want of effects whereonto to levy such fine, such offender shall be imprisoned not exceeding Six nor less than Three months."
