Militia General Orders.

FREDERICTON, 14th JULY, 1803.

WHEREAS repeated and positive Orders have been issued by His EXCELLENCY the CAPTAIN-GENERAL to the COLONELS of the several Regiments of Militia in the Province of New-Brunswick, particularly in August 1798, and in February 1802, requiring and commanding that the ARMS which had been delivered to the Men of their respective Regiments out of the Public Stores, upon the express condition that they should be returned when called for: And Whereas the said Orders have not, in many instances, been yet complied with, His EXCELLENCY the CAPTAIN-GENERAL, taking into consideration the indispensable necessity, that at present exists for adopting the most vigorous measures for the defence of the Province—Hereby Orders, that the ARMS belonging to Government, which now remains in the hands of the Regiments of Militia, be instantly produced, and inspected by the COLONELS or OFFICERS commanding, and that a particular return of the state and condition thereof be forthwith transmitted to the Adjutant-General, addressed under cover to "The Honorable Mr. Secretary OF THE FREDERICTON" for the information of His EXCELLENCY.
