

SAINT JOHN, August 23.
A Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol delivery, commenced sitting at Kingston, Kings County, on Tuesday last, at which His Honor Judge BLISS presided. At this Court came on the trial of *William Barrett*, a coloured man, for committing a rape. After a full and impartial trial he was found guilty, and condemned to suffer the punishment of death by hanging, on Saturday the 23d inst. which is this present day. This Negro was well known by the name *Croppy*, (an appellation that he had received from his ears having been cut off by a party of Indians in Nova-Scotia for having attempted the perpetration of a crime similar to that, for which he now atones with his life) and was notorious for many crimes, for which he frequently suffered the punishment of the lash.—*Courier*.
