**GAOL LIMITS.**

*In the York General Sessions, January Term, 7th Geo. 4.*

**O**RDERED, that the LIMITS FOR THE GAOL OF THE COUNTY OF YORK, heretofore established, be altered and amended, and that in future, the following be the Limits for the said Gaol, that is to say:

COMMENCING at the Water's edge of the River St. John, where a continuation of the Southerly line of St. John-street would intersect the same, thence along the said line to Province Row, thence along the East side of Province Row to the side walk on the North side of Church-street, thence along the said side walk to Brunswick-street, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick-street to St. John-street aforesaid, thence along the Southerly side of St. John street to George street, thence along the Westerly side of George street to Regent-street, thence along the Northerly side of Regent street to Brunswick street aforesaid, thence along the Westerly side of Brunswick-street to Carleton street, thence along the Northerly side of Carleton street and a continuation thereof to the Water's edge, and thence following the course of the River at the Water's edge to the place of beginning.
