## JAMAICA,

FALMOUTH, July 18.

Another infringement of the Order in Council.—The American brig Luey, Church, direct from New-York, was spoken off this port on Saturday se'nnight, bound to Montego Bay, for orders, where, it appears, she obtained a supply of water, and "from some understanding relative to a market," she proceeded next day to St. Thomas's. This communication of American vessels with a port in this Island, in defiance of the Order in Council, is rather more than would be permitted to British vessels on the American coast, for by their Act concerning Navigation, which came into full force on the 1st, it is enacted that "every such vessel, so excluded from the ports of the United States, that shall enter or attempt to enter the same, in violation of this act, shall with the tackle, apparel, and furniture, together with the cargo on board such vessel, be forfeited to the United States."—*Cornwall Courier.*
