His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Suite, with Lady Douglas and Family, left the Seat of Government yesterday morning, in His Excellency's Yacht, on a visit to St. John: The day was remarkably fine, and the wind fresh and favourable.

There is no later European Intelligence of importance than that furnished in our last. Very interesting information will however be found in the Pages of this day's Impression.

We understand it is in contemplation to erect a new Church in Fredericton on a superior scale: and as it is very evident the present Church affords but little accommodation for the majority of the families of the respectable Tradesmen of the Town, and for the poorer classes none whatever, (to the use of the last of whom a large portion of the new Building will be appropriated) and is in other respects by no means adequate to the fast increasing Population of this Town and neighbourhood; we cordially hail this interesting circumstance as one of great importance to the Cause of Christianity, and for which, we believe, we are indebted to the continued Munificence of His Most Gracious Majesty, and the indefatigable zeal of our Governor.

We are informed His Excellency, during one of his late visits to the upper part of the Country, met with a very aged and destitute Indian, in whose welfare His Excellency has taken a lively interest. The Indian, whose name is Piere Toma, lives at Meductic, and is, according to his own statement, ninety-three years old. His Excellency, deeming him to be a very proper object of Charity, caused him to come down to Fredericton, and immediately directed the Commissioners for superintending Indian Affairs to have him decently clothed, and

relieve his present wants, and also to adopt measures for his future relief and sustenance. It is worthy of remark that while putting on his new Apparel he seemed to manifest the most sincere joy and gratitude. It was also discovered, from the aged Indian's statements, that he was a Soldier, in the battle on the Heights of Abraham (in '59 we think) where he lost an arm and an eye; and this circumstance, we believe, His Excellency intends to inquire into, and if found to be correct, Piere Toma will no doubt meet with a cordial Benefactor in His Excellency and be provided for in a sure and comfortable manner during the remainder of his days.

His Excellency and Family attended Divine Service in the Queensbury Church on Sunday week last, on their return from a visit to the Seat of the Honourable the Chief Justice, when His Excellency was pleased, in the name of His Majesty, to present to the Wardens and Vestry a handsome sum towards the completion of the interior of that Church.

We perceive several Launches have recently taken place in this and the neighbouring Provinces, but we are obliged to defer a more particular notice of them till our next.

We have perused the favor sent us by the Editor of the Montreal Gazette, and cannot help saying that we were highly gratified in doing so. We have not been inattentive to the circumstances, with so much truth and ability, discussed in that favor, altho' we have as yet abstained from making any comments. We beg to reassure the Editor of the Montreal Gazette that we truly anticipate his politeness, and will not fail to embrace the first occasion to endeavour to requite it in the way suggested.

The examination of the Pupils of the Grammar School annexed to the College under the immediate charge of the Rev. Mr. McCawley took place on the 23rd ultimo before the Governor and Trustees of the College, agreeably to the Regulations. The Pupils of this School, as usual, acquitted themselves highly to the satisfaction of the Board, both in Classical Literature and in the Elements of Mathematical Science. It is highly gratifying to witness the solid improvement made by the Pupils of this School at every semi-annual Examination, and which we will venture to say is not surpassed in any Institution of the same kind. On the subsequent day the Pupils of the English School, under the care of Mr. Holbrook, was also examined. The Specimens which the Scholars exhibited in Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, English Grammar, and Geography, were such as to reflect great honor upon the ability and attention of their Instructor, and on their own industry and diligence.
