The following circumstances, however, communicated to us by Roskell & Son, the chronometer makers, in Church-street, are too interesting to be passed over. Captain Bennett's chronometer, after observing for a considerable length of time, an uniform rate of 7 10ths of a second gaining, and, being nine minutes forty-two seconds of Greenwich time, when the vessel left New York, was found when compared in Liverpool, to be twenty-four minutes thirty-three seconds fast of Greenwich: and three lever gold watches, belonging to three gentlemen passengers by the ship, contracted the magnetic power to such a degree as actually to require the principal part of the steel work to be renewed.

"Such is the effect," observes a correspondent, who has transmitted us the above account, "produced on the steel work in the watches, that they have the power of the magnet so far, as to act the same as the load-stone."
