At a Special Session of the Peace, of our Lord the King, holden at the County Court House in Fredericton, in and for the County of York, on the 6th day of February, 1827.

IT IS ORDERED, that from and after the 7th instant, the ASSIZE of BREAD in the Town of Fredericton, be as follows:—

The Sixpenny Wheaten Loaf to weigh 2lb. 3oz.

And other Loaves in proportion.

AND further Ordered, that each Baker do plainly mark the Initials

of his Name on every Loaf of Bread, to be baked by him, together with the figures 3 6, or 12, (as the case may be,) to denote the price in pence, under a penalty of Ten shillings for each and every offence.
