

AN ORDINANCE.

of Assize and Nisi Prius in some of the Counties in this Province, as appointed by an Ordinance bearing date the eighteenth day of lanuary in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, have been found incovenient; And whereas it is fit that a Court of Assize and Nisi Prius, should be held in the newly erected County of Kent, at a certain and fixed time, once in every year. I do therefore, by and with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Council, hereby or dain and declare, that from henceforth, the times for holding the Courts of Assize and Nisi Prius, appointed in and by the said recited Ordinance, should be altered, and newly appointed, with regard to the several Counties hereinafter mentioned, its manner following, that is to say; that the Court appointed to be holden in the County of Nortnumberland, on the fourth Tuesday of September, shall, in lieu thereof, be holden on the last Tuesday in June, in each and every year; that the Court appointed to be holden in the City and County of Saint John, on the fourth Tuesday in August, shall in lieu there of, be holden on the third Tues day in June, in each and every year; and that the Court appointed to be holden in Kings County, on the fourth Tuesday in July, shall, in lieu thereof, be holden on the fourth Tuesday in August, in each and every year. And I do turther, by and with the advice and consent aforesaid, ordain and apholden in and for the said County of Kent, on the fourth Tuesday in September, in each and every year. The said several Courts hereby appointed, of the Judges, halding such Courts respectively, he necessary for the dispatch of the business depending. And of this Regulation, His Majesty's Jus tices of the Supreme Court, and all other persons whom it may concern, will take due notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
