Boston, January 9.

By the Royal William from England.—By the Royal William, steam ship, which arrived at New York on Sunday, we have received our files of London papers to the evening of December 14, and Liverpool to the 15th. The Royal William took a southerly passage, passing near Madeira, and had mild and comfortable weather. The length of her passage was 20 days. The agents have given notice that she will sail on her return on the 16th inst., and not on the 14th.

Sir John Colborne has been appointed Governor General of the Canadas, with the same powers which were conferred on Lord Durham. These consist of the ordinary powers of Governor General, with the addition of the power of making ordinances with the concurrence of his Council, with certain restrictions, having the effect of acts of the Colonial Legislature.—This appointment was confirmed at a cabinet council held at Windsor, December 12. The London Times says—

"This appointment of Sir John Colborne as Governor General of Canada, vests in that gallant officer all the powers which were vested in the Earl of Durham, both as to their nature and extent—powers which we feel persuaded will be exercised with honor to himself and advantage to the colony—of which he has already given satisfactory evidence in the promptitude and skill with which he has met the recent emergencies."
