NEW BRUNSWICK IN CHANCERY.

Tuesday the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty nine.

Between James Gilmore and Alexander Rankin, Complainants, and Stephen Haidaker, Defendant.

FORASMUCH as the Court was this present day informed by Mr. Street, of Council for the Complainants, that the Plaintiff had exhibited their bill in this Honorable Court against the Defendant on the sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, as by the certificate of the Register appears, and had taken out process of Subpoena returnable the twelfth day of June last, requiring the Defendant to appear to, and answer the same, but that the Defendant left this Province some time in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine, or in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and hath not since returned to this Province, and that there is reason to believe that the said Defendant is now living in some part of Great Britain, but that his place of residence is unknown, as by affidavit appears, and that he cannot be served with the process of this Court, and the said certificate and affidavit being now read; It is ordered—That the Defendant do appear to the Plaintiff's bill on or before the first Tuesday in September next.
