And the said Defendant comes by its Attorney, (or "in person, &c.") and says (or in case it be pleaded as to part only add "as to being part of the sum in the Declaration or count of the Declaration mentioned") or "as to the residue of the sum of () that the Plaintiff ought not further to maintain his action, because the Defendant now brings into Court the sum of () ready to be paid to the Plaintiff, and the Defendant further says that the Plaintiff has not sustained damages (or in actions of debt "that he is not indebted to the Plaintiff") to a greater amount than the said sum of &c., in respect to the cause of action in the declaration mentioned" (or "in the introductory part of the plea mentioned") and this he the Defendant is ready to verify, wherefore he prays judgment, if the Plaintiff ought further to maintain his action thereof against him; and no other plea shall be pleaded to the said action or to so much thereof as the said plea of payment into Court is applicable.

II. It is further Ordered, That upon a Rule or Judge's order being made for paying money into Court under the said Act, the money shall be paid to the Clerk at the time of filing the plea, together with his poundage thereon, and the Clerk shall make a minute of such payment in the margin of the plea, and shall also give a memorandum of such payment to the Plaintiff's Attorney; which sum shall be paid out to the Plaintiff's Attorney on demand.

III. It is further Ordered, That the Plaintiff, after delivery of a plea of payment of money into Court, shall be at liberty to reply to the same, by accepting the sum so paid into Court in full satisfaction and discharge of the cause of action, in respect of which it has been paid in, and he shall be at liberty in that case to tax his costs of suit, and in case of non-payment thereof within ten days, to sign judgment for his costs of suit, or the Plaintiff may reply "that he sustained damages" for "that the Defendant was and is indebted to him" as the case may be) to a greater amount than the said sum, "and in the event of an issue thereon being found for the Defendant, the Defendant shall be entitled to judgment and his costs of suit;" Provided that if the sum of money paid into Court in any action not summary would have been recoverable under the summary form, the Plaintiff, if he take the money out of Court in discharge of the action, shall not be entitled to more than summary costs, unless he obtain the order of the Court, or a Judge for the larger costs, upon good causes shewn therefor.
